The Community

The towns of St. John and Endicott are the business and social hubs of Northwest Whitman County. Both are strategically situated in the vast rolling hills region of grain farming known as *The Palouse*. Endicott is just 35 miles NW from Pullman, the home of Washington State University; St. John is 52 miles SW of Spokane and 35 miles south of Cheney, the home of Eastern Washington University. Spanning 475 square miles, the St. John and Endicott Cooperative Schools serve the educational needs of northwest Whitman County.

The School

St. John – Endicott High School is a comprehensive four-year high school enrolling 75 students grades nine through twelve. Currently, the St. John and Endicott Cooperative consists of one high school (grades 9-12) located in St. John, one middle school (grades 6-8) located in Endicott, with independent elementary schools serving each town.

The Curriculum

The academic program is organized into seven periods, with yearlong classes. Students enrolled in all of these 50-minute classes can earn a maximum of 7 credits yearly.

Grading and Ranking

St. John – Endicott High School assigns letter grades using the 4.0 system.
